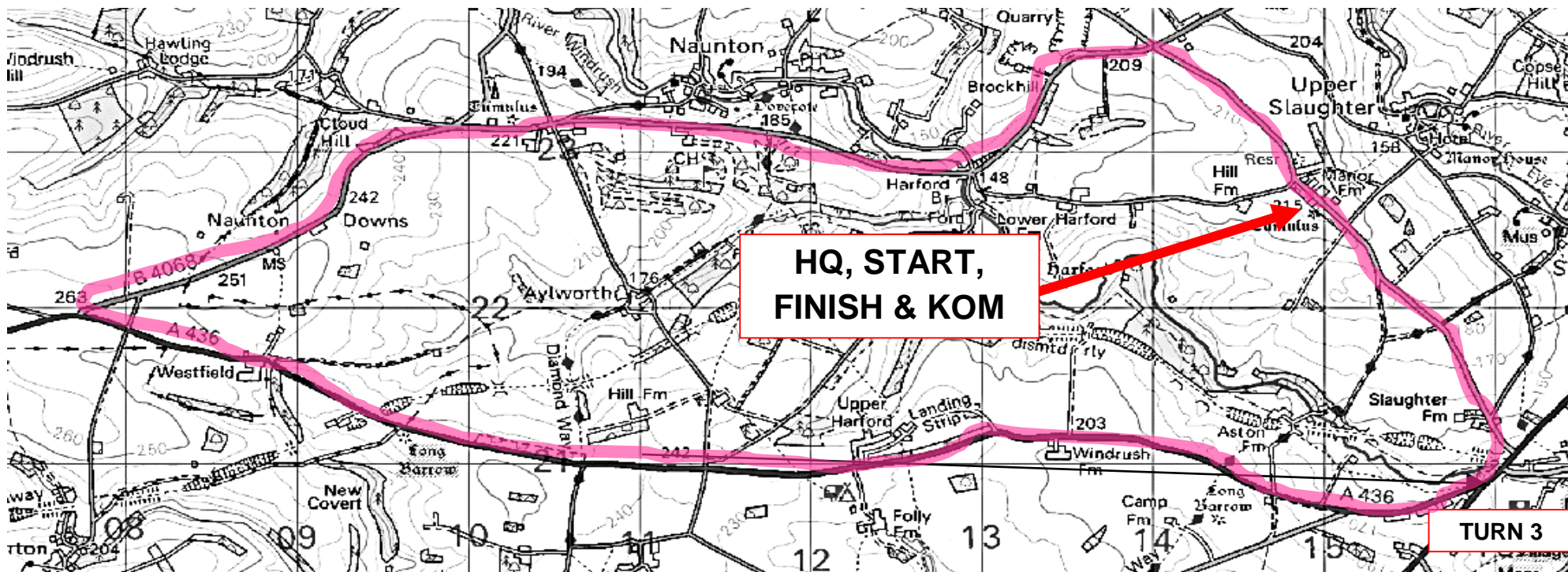

Rider safety guide

This race is run under British Cycling's technical regulations and under standard highway conditions therefore you **MUST** abide by the rules of the road.

Safety

- You are not on closed roads and you will face oncoming traffic

Marshals (static or moto)

- Direct riders around the course and warn other road users a race is taking place
- Marshals do not create road closures or make it safe to race on the right hand side of the road

Actions

- You are responsible for your own actions
- Race on the left hand side of the road – do not cross solid white lines and always avoid crossing broken white lines
- Persistent offenders will be penalised (eg disqualification or a fine)
- If necessary the race will be stopped

Responsibility

- Look after each other, behave responsibly and safely
- Do not take unnecessary risks - your actions could have serious consequences

Think

- About your position on the road
- Rider behaviour is critical to protecting the future of road racing
- We all have a part to play

INFORMATION FOR RIDERS

- The course consists of wide, quiet roads with good surfaces. It does not pass through villages or towns and we expect no parked cars on the course.
- Take care on the descent into turn 3
- **If you fall behind the last vehicle in the race convoy, you must pay extra attention to traffic & stop at give way signs** – as you would if you were on a training ride.
- A neutral service is provided. Please bring a spare wheel.

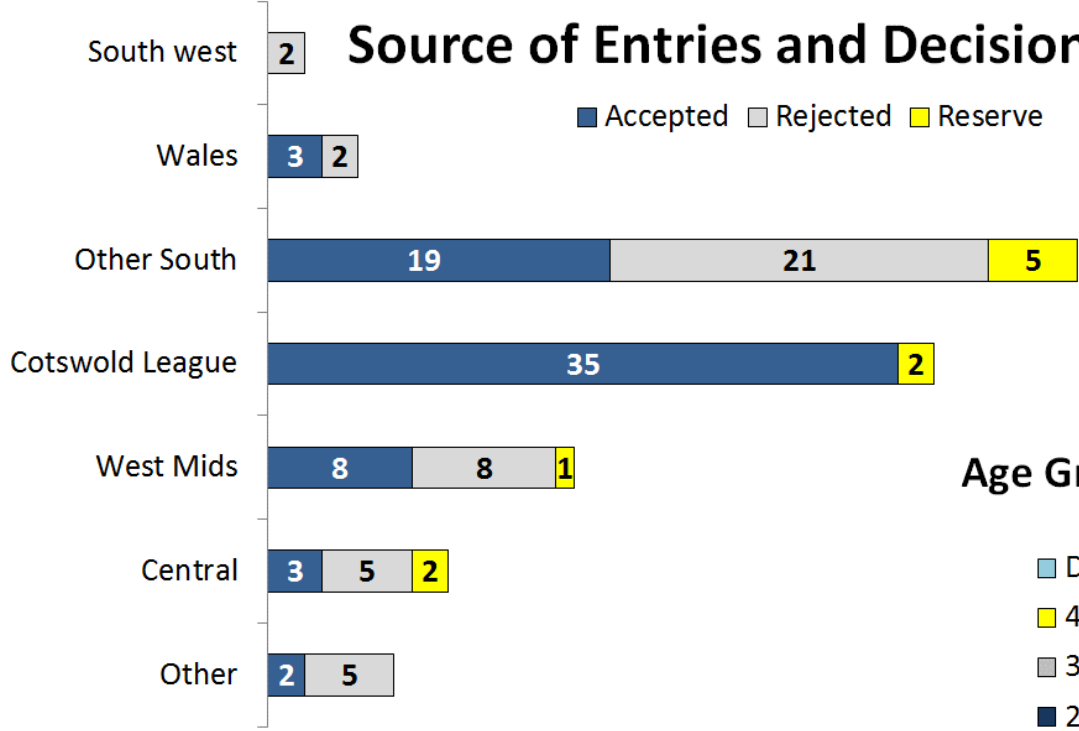

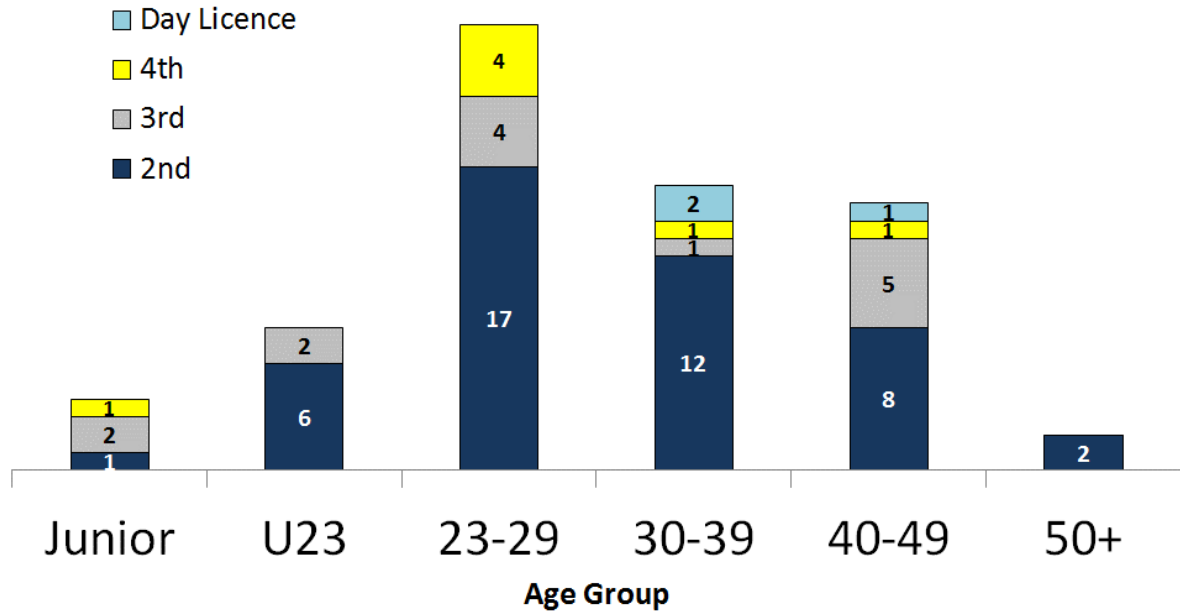




Source of Entries and Decision

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE 2013 EDITION



Sixty three riders started the race, held on a very hot 14th July.

On the first lap, Dean Robson (Somerset RC – now riding for Cheltenham) went away on his own and built up a lead of around 50 seconds and took an early lead in the points competition. He was caught around 15 miles later.

On the third lap the winning breakaway went clear with Peter Medhurst (University of Exeter) and Daniel Guest (Army Cycling Union) initially going clear. They were then joined by local rider Wayne Coombs (Winchcombe CC) and James Phillips after five miles. Richard Cleaver (Leisure Lakes) rode across the 50 second gap on his own on the final lap.

Minor panic spread amongst the race officials when the sun stroked judges forgot to sound the final lap bell, though the riders got the message from marshals on turn two.

Cleaver launched a big attack at the bottom of the final 2.5 kilometre climb. Guest, Medhurst and Coombes couldn't stay with him, though he couldn't shake Phillips. The Severn RC rider just edged out Cleaver on the line to take the win.

The bunch, down to just 30 riders, came in 2 minutes 15 seconds behind. Daniel Marks (Bristol RC) won the sprint. Medhurst won the king of the mountains award and the under-23 award.
